St. Felicitas Catholic School Summer Program Class Descriptions



July 8– July 26, 2024 8:45am-3:00pm Morning Care 8:00-8:30am and Extended Daycare 3:00pm-5:30pm

Academic Enrichment Program (8:45am - 12:00pm)

<u>Math:</u> This summer course is designed to help students review and retain foundational mathematical concepts. Sessions will consist of math review, math games, interactive activities, and practice problems that build number sense and master math facts in a fun learning environment. Activities include daily math sprints for math fact fluency and math stations for differentiated instruction.

ELA: Students will receive vocabulary lessons, learn about grammar, practice reading literature, and learn skills to be a good writer. Lower elementary students will learn phonics skills to support reading. Students will also learn how to make inferences, read context clues, analyze and summarize information. To improve their writing skills students will learn how to express opinions, develop fluent sentences and middle school students will learn to write a well composed essay.

Recess 10:15am - 10:30am Lunch 12:00pm -1:00pm

Electives Program (1:00pm-3:00pm)

Incoming TK-Kindergarten

- Activities will be done with the classroom teacher inside the classroom. Activities will include nap time, art, cooking, music.

Electives (1st-8th Grade)

- Drama- Students will learn about stage presence and improve public speaking skills, be assigned characters, memorize lines, assemble costumes and scenery. Drama is a wonderful way for students to build confidence and creativity.
- Cooking- Students will learn to make a complete day's worth of meals breakfast, lunch, dinner, appetizer/snack, and dessert. Kitchen prep and cooking skills will be demonstrated and practiced. Of course the real fun is eating everything they make!!
- **Sports Camp-** Spend a week enjoying a variety of sports activities including Relay Races, Kickball, Basketball, Volleyball, Flag Football, and more!
- Arts & Crafts- Create a new piece of art each day with different mediums.
- Spanish- Learn some basic Spanish language skills through games, songs and activities.

St. Felicitas Catholic School features an academic enrichment program from 8:45am – 12:00pm and an electives program from 1:00pm-3:00pm with school yard supervision available from 8:30-8:45am and 3:00pm-3:15pm. Morning Care is available from 8:00am-8:30am and Extended Daycare from 3:00pm-5:30pm for an additional fee.

GENERAL INFORMATION and POLICIES

Sign In/Out

Children arriving between 8:00-8:30am must be accompanied by a parent and signed in by the Extended Day staff. Students who arrive after 8:30am may be dropped off in the school yard. Gates open at 8:30am. During afternoon Extended Day, children may only be signed out and picked up by an adult listed on their Registration Form. Children who are picked up after 5:30pm will be charged a Late Fee of \$1.00/1 min. per child, paid at the time of pick up.

School Dismissal

The children are dismissed to the schoolyard at 3:00pm. Children who are not picked up by 3:15pm will be signed in to Extended Care. Students who are not enrolled in the Extended Care Program will be charged accordingly at the time of pick up (\$10/hour or fraction thereof.)

Expectations for Student Behavior

Student's actions and attitudes should always reflect a Christian ethic, and their behavior should be in accordance with the moral and religious expectations outlined by our school philosophy. Self - Discipline is attained when students work cooperatively with the teachers, fellow students, and principal

toward the attainment of class and school objectives. Discipline is an aspect of helping students form self-discipline and not a form of punishment. The purpose of discipline is:

- To build a sense of Christian community.
- To produce self-disciplined students.
- To provide a classroom climate conducive to learning.

Respect and responsibility are essential in our Christ-centered environment, allowing optimal learning and growth.

The following are the guidelines for these expectations:

- 1. Respectful behavior toward oneself, others, and the surrounding environment is expected of students at all times.
- 2. Students are required to contribute to the learning environment.
- 3. Students are expected to follow all school procedures and policies.

NOTE: There is zero tolerance for dangerous behavior or physical violence. An immediate suspension or possible expulsion from the program will result if such behavior occurs.

If a child is disruptive, dangerous, or disrespectful to children and/or staff, a prompt resolution must be accomplished. If a problem arises in the first week into the program and conferencing is unable to resolve the situation, the family will be asked to leave and tuition and childcare fees for the remainder of the summer will be returned. In weeks two and three, if after working with a family without resolution for unacceptable behavior, the child will be asked to leave and no prepaid fees will be returned.

Dress Code

Although it is summer-time and we want the children to be comfortable, your child's safety is very important. Please check your children before they leave home and observe the following dress code:

- Shorts, sweats and tee shirts are acceptable.
 - No short-shorts or low rise or "sagging" pants, pants/shorts must fit appropriately
 - No spaghetti straps or low cut tops or crop tops that show your stomach or midriff Tee shirts and blouses must extend to the top of the pants and tank tops must have wide straps and not spaghetti straps. Please wear undergarments if tops are sheer.
- Socks and closed-toed shoes are to be worn. Please no open-toe sandals or flip-flops. During the week you have sports, you cannot wear Crocs and must wear tennis shoes.

If you have questions regarding our dress code please speak with our Director.

Please label all clothing, backpacks, lunch boxes and water bottles.

Items Not Permitted on Campus

The following items are not permitted on campus for either Extended Day or the Academic/Enrichment Day, and should be left at home: dangerous or violent objects; cell phones, iPods, or other electronic devices; gum, candy, soda, toys, games, etc. If such items are brought to school, they will be kept by the Director and given to the parent when they arrive to pick up the child. Dangerous or violent items will be confiscated and the child's parent will be called to pick up the items, and the child may be sent home. Please note the school is not responsible for lost, misplaced/stolen, or damaged items.

Lunches and Snacks

Each child needs to bring a morning snack to enjoy at recess, a water bottle, and a healthy lunch. The school is a soda, energy drink, candy and gum free zone. Be sure all lunch boxes/bags and water bottles are labeled.

Absences and Vacations

Please call the School Office between 8:00-8:45am to report absences.

Medications

If your child requires medication during Summer Program hours, the school must have a physician-signed Medication Form on file to dispense medications. <u>Medication Forms may be found in the office</u>. Please do not send over-the-counter medications with your child without submitting a Medication Form.

Please make us aware of any medical conditions or allergies your child may have, especially food or bee sting allergies.

Illness or Accident

In the event of an injury or if your child becomes ill, you will be notified. Please be sure your registration paperwork includes an accurate number where you, or a designated adult, may be reached during Summer School hours.

Field Trips

Walking field trips are planned to the park. Students must have a signed field trip form to attend. The Field Trip Permission Slip, which will include locations, dates and times, will be distributed at the time of enrollment.

After reading and discussing the Summer School Family Handbook, parents and students must sign the verification page below and return this form together with their registration.
